About the Securities and Exchange Commission Historical Society

The Securities and Exchange Commission Historical Society has been formed to preserve the history of the SEC, to sponsor research and educational programs regarding the SEC, and to enhance understanding of the development of the U.S. and the world's capital markets.

The Society plans to hold annual meetings of members, to sponsor important policy conferences, to develop oral histories regarding significant regulatory and market developments, to sponsor research and publications, to maintain historical archives for personal papers of SEC Commissioners and staff and for papers of market participants, and to create a library and museum facility.

The Society is a nonprofit District of Columbia corporation. It has applied to the Internal Revenue Service for a determination that it is tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Society expects to be qualified to receive charitable contributions pending receipt of a favorable determination. A Board of Trustees will govern the Society.

The Society's success will depend upon broad support from participants in the capital markets, including institutions and individuals.

Membership categories and their annual contributions include Students and SEC Staff, \$25; Regular Members, \$100; Contributing Members, \$1,000; Sustaining Members, \$2,500; and Sponsoring Members, \$5,000. Institutional memberships are also available. By preserving the history of the Securities and Exchange Commission, the Society will provide a valuable factual base that will aid subsequent securities market regulators in reaching sound decisions. By sponsoring scholarly research and educational programs, the Society will provide assistance to those interested in the securities markets.

 - Record oral histories
 - Establish a repository for SEC, SRO,
 Congressional, and securities industry
